Hello there!

I'm Carmen Berkley, re:power's Board Chair and a proud alumna of this organization's leadership development programming. I am thrilled to be leading this organization through its ongoing transformation, both internally and externally. In 2018, our organization took on a new name, which meant a bolder vision for the future and a radical mission to build power and uncover leadership within communities of color. And as our metamorphosis took place, our team continued to grow our programmatic work without missing a beat. Here are some major highlights from last year:

- **900 leaders** throughout Arizona, Texas, Maryland, California, Washington, New York, Nevada, Michigan & Minnesota participated in **32 trainings**, building the pipeline of progressive leaders for the future;
- In partnership with **53 key organizations** across this country, re:power trained over **900** people in everything from integrated civic and voter engagement to advanced strategic planning skills.
- As the only organization doing critical work in the **Movement Technology** space, re:power is proud of the **860 individuals** who were trained through our Digital Organizing Schools, Data & Analytics Camps, and digital security trainings;
- We launched our **Online Coding Cohort** to democratize access to technical training, reaching **200 organizers and community leaders**.
- In December 2018, re:power hosted our **2018 RootsCamp Unconference**, bringing together **a thousand technologists, organizers, grassroots organizations, and campaigners** for a multi-day convening focused on sharing lessons, building skills, and connecting with activists across the movement.

2018 was packed with activity and the pieces of our transformation finally came together as we unveiled our new identity at RootsCamp. re:power is a clear articulation of the values and ideals this organization has held for the past sixteen years, with a sharper focus on the people we are here to serve.

NEW LEADERSHIP RISING

In June 2019, re:power hired **Karundi Williams** as the new **Executive Director**. Karundi is based in Washington, D.C. and leads our national team of strategists, organizers, and technologists towards re:power's bold mission of building transformative political power with and for communities of color, at all levels in our government and power structures.

Karundi brings an extensive network of progressive connections, political knowledge and deep relationships with key communities to her work at re:power. Formerly the Political Director for the Midwest Initiative and Director of State and Local Programs at SEIU, one of the largest labor unions in the world, Karundi understands what it takes to build power for communities of color. Her work included forming coalitions between elected officials, civic organizations, and local progressive organizers as well as managing a host of state legislative campaigns. Her political analysis and skill in bringing folks together is key to re:power's core goal of building political power with action-oriented partners.

In 2019 and beyond, Karundi will ensure that re:power's sixteen year commitment to cultivating leaders that authentically reflect and serve the communities they most impact is stronger than ever. She will continue to create ecosystems for communities of color to build their political power to create social change—whether it be community organizing, connecting everyday people to policy platforms or investing in infrastructure and resources. This is what makes her an effective and successful leader.

Supporting Karundi's leadership as the Board Chair of re:power is a commitment that I'm making because I believe that to create impactful change with and for communities of color, the decision-makers have to represent those communities. The Board and staff at re:power are energized and excited to enter this next chapter of inclusive politics as an organization with a bold mission and vision, proudly led by women of color, and grounded in the legacies of our communities and ancestors who have paved the way for us to be here today.

A Year in Review

Bold and Unapologetic

When we thought about our name, we thought about what we do best: training and building with communities on the frontlines of grassroots, electoral, and issue organizing who are fighting for social change.

And we heard from our partners and co-conspirators that they were eager for an updated analysis around power and justice.

re:power offers an expansion of what justice looks like for our people in a framework of inclusive politics. We're transforming how we think about power, who holds it, and how we wield it in our communities—we're looking at power in every context and speaking truth to it.

We offer a different narrative of who is a leader, who participates in politics, and what outcomes we are fighting for—and it's all happening against the backdrop of our current political climate, and what we're gearing up for in the years to come.

Today's political ecosystem is very different from when we opened our doors sixteen years ago as Wellstone Action, so we thought about how we could transform into who we were already becoming.

We are inspired by how movements have shape-shifted to make more space for communities at the margins who are organizing to gain power. Our communities—people of color, LGBTQ folks, women, the working class, immigrants and others—are breaking into mainstream politics and institutions and demanding the structures adapt to meet their needs. This shift requires us to be more explicit about our values, about what progressivism represents, and about who we are referencing when we say “our people.”

Mission

We are a team of organizers, strategists, and technologists dedicated to building transformative political power. We do this by partnering with individuals, organizations, and coalitions across the country to uncover leaders within communities and create radical change.

Vision

We imagine a future of inclusive politics where decisions about our communities are made by our communities at all levels.

Values

RE: LOCAL LEADERSHIP

We believe that by rooting our work in local communities we can cultivate leaders that authentically reflect and serve the communities they most impact.

RE: WINNING

We believe that real wins shift the narrative and support change over the long-term—how we do the work matters as much as the outcome.

RE: BUILDING POLITICAL POWER

We believe in co-creating with action-oriented partners to expand the ways people think about politics.

RE: JUSTICE

We believe in expanding our definition of justice to confront interconnected systems of oppression that keep us from our liberation.

RE: TECHNOLOGY

We believe in using technology as a space within which we can build power.

Our Movement's Largest “Unconference”

In December 2018, we hosted our second **RootsCamp**, welcoming nearly 1,000 attendees, this time in Baltimore, MD, a city with a deeply rooted local organizing culture, but which also has the proximity and access to critical national organizations in nearby Washington, D.C. Organizers, digital and data practitioners, campaigners, and many others gathered to experience our movement's largest “unconference.” The agenda was designed and executed on the spot by attendees, to deliver skills building, lessons learned in the field, and inspiration to their fellow participants.

In addition to the breakout sessions, we had special guest speakers and teachers, such as Sayu Bhojwani from New American Leaders, Selina Musuta, a Ford/Mozilla Fellow, Representative Ilhan Omar, and activist Deepa Iyer.

Throughout the weekend, we heard from so many brilliant leaders committed to radically changing the world, together. A vision of what's possible in a movement dedicated to practicing inclusive politics couldn't have been more real.

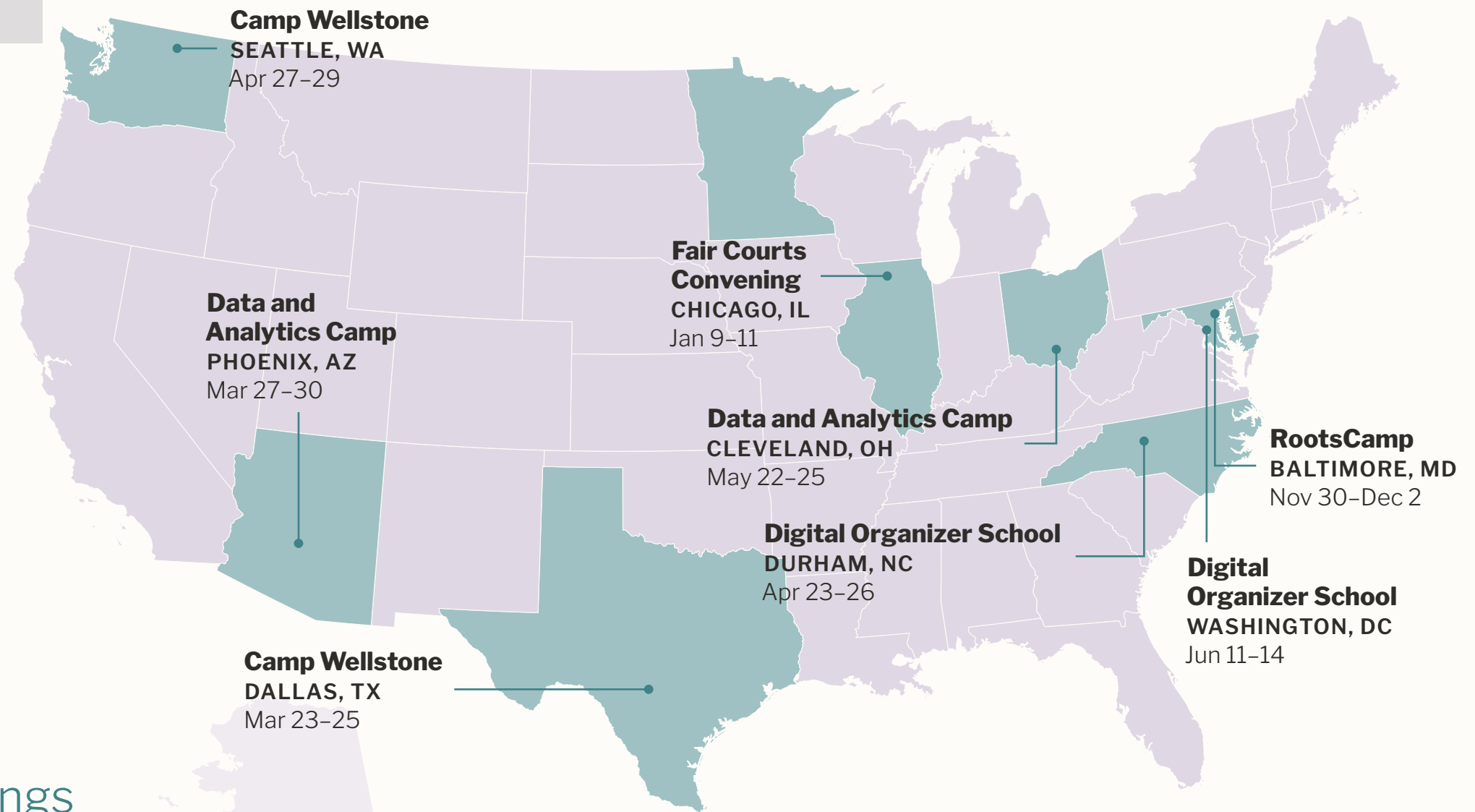
