

(U) FEATURES (U) CHALLENGES (U) Private messaging: Hidden from public view. (U) Closed and secret groups (U) Closed groups: Content and membership hidden from public view. (U) Varying degrees of privacy (U) Secret groups: No overt indication of group's existence; non-searchable. (II) Direct messaging: Hidden from public view and displays no indication of use Historical content is lost if deleted by one of the users. (U) Protected Tweets: Hidden from public view: do not appear in public search results on Twitter. (U) Private videos: Not included in public search results; only available to (U) Private or unlisted videos specified Google users. (U) Unlisted videos: Not included in search results; viewable to anyone with link, including non-Google users. (U) Instagram Direct: Hidden from public view (U) Private profiles: Require user's approval prior to gaining access. (U) Restrictive sharing and retention (U) Retention: Sender may save photo/video prior to sharing. Receiver can take (U) Encrypted snaps and "stories" screenshots to save photos; sender is notified if screenshots are taken. (U) Snaps: Deleted within 10 seconds after viewing; after 30 days if unviewed. (U) Stories: Deleted after 24 hours.

(U) Intractable encryption: Instant messaging, file sharing, screen sharing, and

video are secured with intractable encryption. Although voice messages are

encrypted, once listened to, they are transferred from Skype's servers to the

user's local machines and stored as unencrypted files.




Open Source is research that exhausts any publicly available information, including the internet and social media.




Moving Forward
